

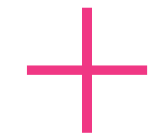

When I was asked to lead design for the new People magazine app for Dotdash Meredith in 2024, I dove deep into all the newly available tools and our relationship with OpenAI to see how I could optimize my workflow and do better smarter and faster. The app launched to become #1 in the App Store. I've been using AI to sketch and prototype new products as ideas have been coming to me since then. These are some of them.

We've reached an inflection point in creativity.

AI Tools

ChatGPT - trend mapping, insight generation, personas, PRDs, Tech Specs & pitch decks

Gemini - breadth-first research, live web grounding, and scanning across multiple sources for quick comparisons

Claude - narrative flow, scenario mapping, brainstorming

NotebookLM - deep analysis of documents, contextual knowledge extraction

Figma Make - natural language UI builder with live editing and fast iteration

Glide - natural language UI builder for mobile apps

Builder.io - natural language UI builder for mobile apps

Workflow

AI-Augmented UX Workflow

→ Ideation → Sketch/Design → Prototype (low/high fidelity) → Iteration

Brainstorming flows: Generate multiple versions of a user flow or interaction model.
Sketching UI ideas: Convert text descriptions into rough wireframes or visual sketches.
Naming / content ideation: Quickly produce brand language, microcopy, or naming directions.

- IA suggestions: Cluster content into logical categories.
- Flow validation: Ask AI to stress-test a flow ("What happens if the user cancels at step 3?").
- Accessibility checks: Flag jargon, readability, or WCAG issues in early copy.

- Wireframe → mockup: AI converts sketches to Figma layouts.
- Auto-populate with realistic data: Generate diverse user names, photos, text blocks.
- Design variations: Rapidly explore visual themes.

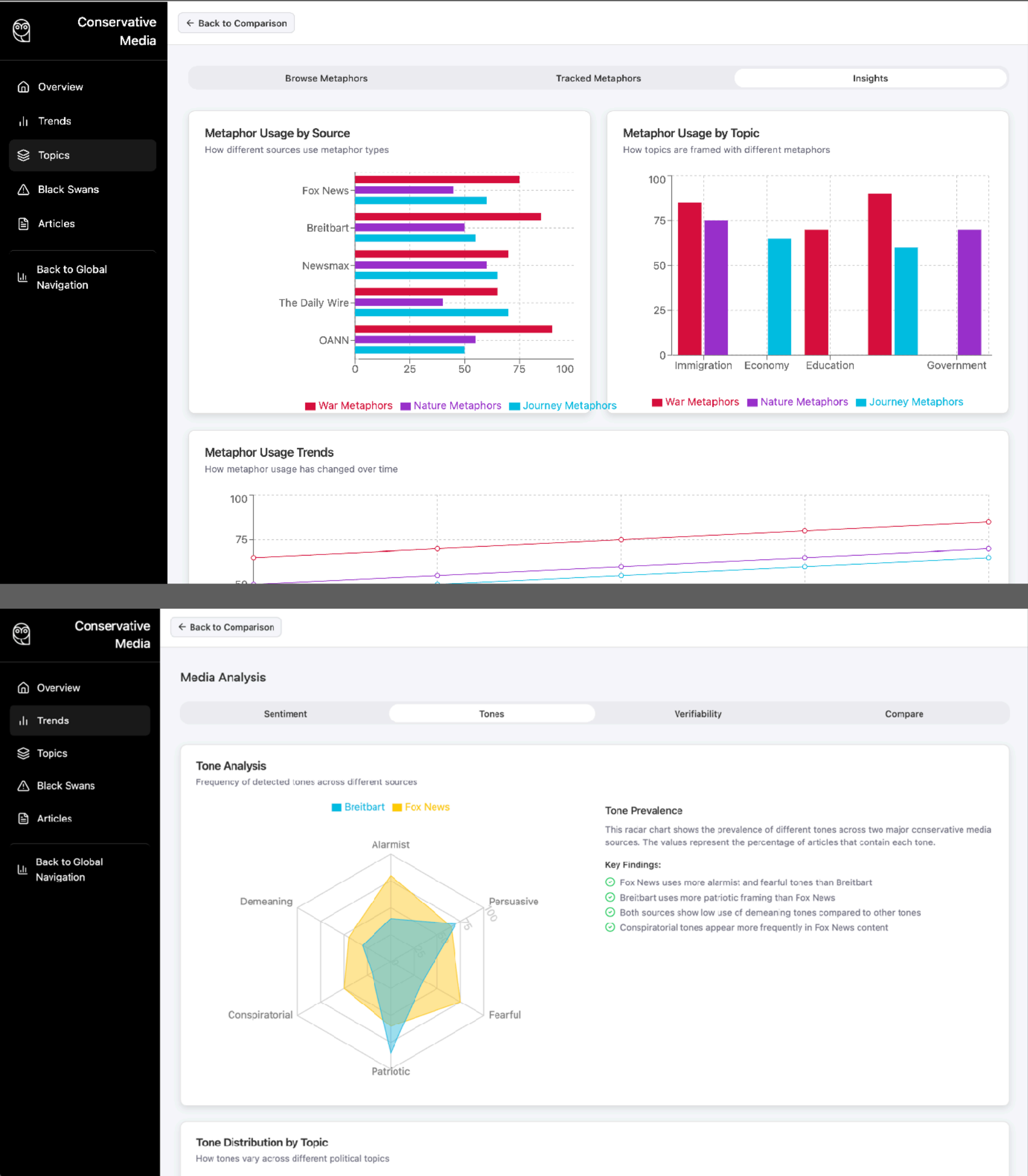
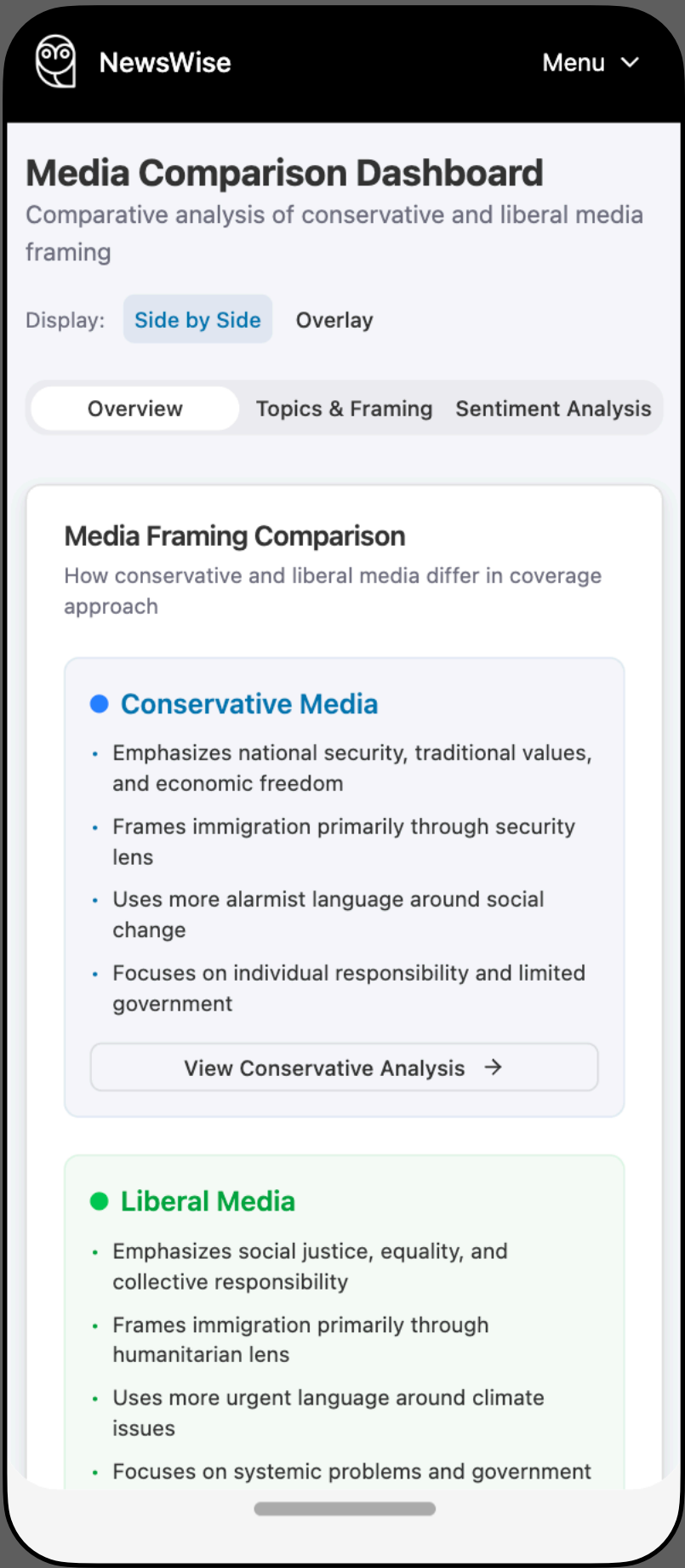

The News

My research while at Dow Jones/The Wall Street Journal and Dotdash Meredith revealed the challenges publishers have encouraging readers to read articles. The following designs/prototypes are meant to help readers engage more deeply with the news they read.

As a student of anthropology interested in linguistics, I built this prototype to help me understand sentiment, framing metaphors and splitting language being used by both conservative and liberal media sources.



Many readers, including myself, read a news article without understanding historical context or precedence. What happened before? What led to this? I created this browser extension for Chrome to help readers become better informed.

New Healthcare Bill Could Transform Medical Millions

A comprehensive new healthcare bill introduced in Congress this week could transform Medicare access while addressing long-standing issues in rural healthcare delivery.




The bipartisan legislation, co-sponsored by Representatives from both parties, aims to address the millions of Americans that have left millions of Americans without adequate healthcare options. The bill includes provisions for telemedicine expansion, rural hospital funding, and streamlined enrollment processes.

"This represents the most significant healthcare reform effort since the Affordable Care Act," said Dr. Sarah Chen, a healthcare policy expert at Georgetown University. "The focus on rural communities and underserved populations addresses critical gaps in our current system."

The proposed changes would affect an estimated 15 million Americans currently caught in coverage gaps between state Medicaid programs and private insurance options. Rural hospitals, many facing closure due to financial pressures, would receive dedicated funding streams under the new framework.

Devastating Earthquake Strikes Turkey and Syria: Thousands Feared Dead as International Aid Mobilizes

A powerful 7.8-magnitude earthquake struck southeastern Turkey and northern Syria early Monday morning, causing widespread destruction and triggering a humanitarian crisis that has left thousands dead and many more trapped under rubble.

The earthquake, centered near the Turkish city of **Gaziantep**, was felt across the region at approximately 4:17 AM local time. Initial reports indicate that entire city blocks have collapsed in both Turkey and Syria, with rescue teams working frantically to locate survivors trapped beneath the debris.

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan declared a three-month state of emergency in the affected provinces, including **Kahramanmaras, Gaziantep, Sanliurfa, Diyarbakir, Adana, Adiyaman, Malatya, Osmaniye, Hatay, and Kilis**. The declaration will facilitate rapid deployment of emergency resources and international aid coordination.

In Syria, the situation is particularly dire as the earthquake has compounded existing humanitarian challenges. The northwestern regions of **Aleppo and Idlib**, already struggling with ongoing conflict and displacement, have been severely impacted. Aid organizations report that hospitals and refugee

Climate Change Policies Show Promising Results in Latest Study

A comprehensive new study published in the Journal of Environmental Policy reveals that recent climate change mitigation policies have begun showing measurable positive impacts on carbon emissions reduction across major metropolitan areas.

The research, conducted over a three-year period, analyzed data from 50 major cities worldwide and found that targeted policy interventions have resulted in an average 12% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions compared to baseline projections.

"These findings represent a significant step forward in our understanding of effective climate policy implementation," said Dr. Sarah Martinez, lead researcher at the Institute for Climate Solutions. "The data clearly demonstrates that well-designed policies can create meaningful change."

The study examined various policy approaches including carbon pricing mechanisms, renewable energy incentives, and public transportation investments. Cities that implemented comprehensive policy packages showed the most dramatic improvements.

However, critics argue that the timeframe is too short to draw definitive conclusions about long-term effectiveness, and some question whether the observed changes represent temporary adjustments rather than sustained behavioral shifts.
